Embark in collaboration with the Animal Protection Trust and Vets for future successfully concluded a series of CNVR clinics at the Diyathalawa Air-force camp, National College of education and Bindunuwewa and the neighboring areas. 90 vaccinations, 15 treatments and 64 sterilizations were conducted, The teams were supported by the Diyathalawa Air Force camp and National College of education – Bindunuwewa.
