HERALDING A NEW YEAR WITHOUT FIREWORKS



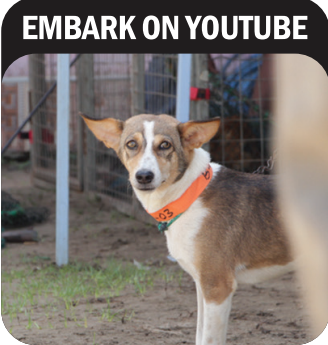
