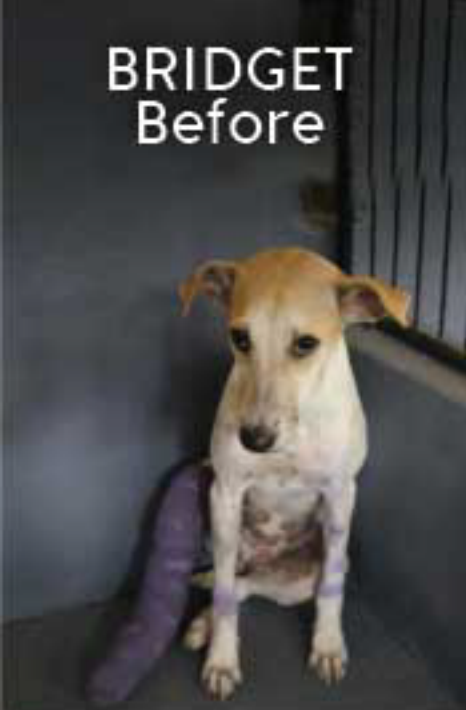

Rescuing PAMY

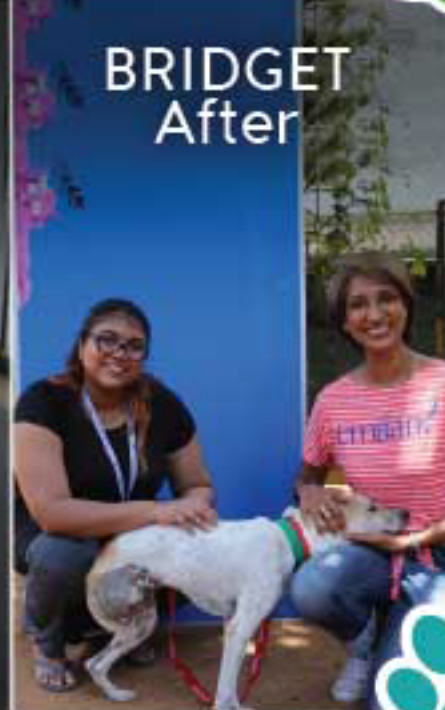

CNVR programmes conducted by Embark

We held 4 CNVR programmes at Katunayake, Panadura, NARA – Colombo 15 and Kalutara Balika Vidyalaya. A total of 75 vaccinations, 34 treatments and 45 sterilizations were done at these locations.
